

## OFFICIAL TRIVIA-UNPLUGGED CONTEST RULES & INFORMATION

- Each team may have ten (10) players playing at any one time.
- Active players on a team will be at a table in the Trivia room. Questions will be asked each hour and you will have the length of 1 song to answer each question.
- Teams will be provided answer sheets for each question. You will also be provided with pencils and scratch paper. At the end of each question, answers will be collected from the secretary location and brought to the scorekeeping area.
- There are no books, no computers, no notes, no paper of any kind, no telephones, no communication devices or any other items we deem undesirable allowed in the room. Cell phones will not be allowed.
- **REPEAT: NO ELECTRONIC DEVICES ARE ALLOWED IN THE COMPETITION AREA.** If the phone in your pocket rings, not only will you be embarrassed, but your team will also be disqualified. If your cell phone is visible, your team will be disqualified. So as you can see, your best bet is to leave it in the car or jacket in another location.
- The members at the table can talk amongst themselves to discuss the answer. No outside help is allowed.
- At the end of the question, the question and answer will be read, and the next question will be asked.
- If you leave the Competition Area during a question, you may only re-enter upon the end of that question.
- No players are allowed into the playing area without a player badge.
- The Competition Area will be monitored for any violations of these rules. You will have the choice to comply with the rules or leave the Competition Area.

The contest will begin at 5:00 PM and last until 9:00 PM. All proceeds will go to supporting Outagamie County Skills Enhancement Program. Team registration will be in advance and the day of the contest. The cost is \$200 per team in advance and \$220 the day of the contest. Pizza and salad are included in the cost.

Registration forms are available online. Forms may be filled out and emailed to [kcalmes@capmail.org](mailto:kcalmes@capmail.org). Forms must be sent no later than October 22nd or dropped off in-person by October 27th. On November 5nd, registration will begin at 4:00 PM. Teams who have registered may pick up their team badges and rule books at that time. Parking will be available. Registration ends at 4:30 PM with the contest beginning at 5:00 PM. At 4:45 PM, the Competition Area will be opened and players can select a table. Again, players may not enter the Competition Area without a team badge.

Team totals will be announced at the beginning of each hour after the break. At the end of the contest, there will be an awards presentation. As usual, the contest will be family oriented and we will be writing questions that test what you know.
