Be Well Waupaca County Resource Fair Brings Resources Together

More than 30 organizations participated in the 3rd Annual Be Well Waupaca County Resource Fair on August 8 in Manawa, bringing a wide range of services together in one welcoming and accessible location.

Six CAP Services programs were represented: Family Crisis Center, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance, Skills Enhancement Program, Early Childhood Development (ECD), Mental Health Navigation, and Community Resource Team. Staff shared information about services ranging from crisis intervention and mental health support to education, career advancement, tax preparation, and community resources.

ECD also hosted a Kids Zone where children enjoyed activities while parents and caregivers explored the fair, helping make the event

accessible and enjoyable for the entire family.

The Resource Fair reached more than 60 households, representing over 160 community members. Attendees also received free haircuts and participated in family portrait sessions, offering families opportunities to feel confident and create meaningful keepsakes. These services also helped address needs that families may otherwise find difficult to prioritize.

CAP Services was proud to participate in this collaborative effort. The event introduced residents to programs and support available throughout Waupaca County while strengthening connections among local organizations, individuals, and families.
